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## Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your cellphone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a cellphone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their cellphone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless telephones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your cellphone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your cellphone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your cellphone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the car's electronic devices are shielded from cellphone RF energy.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the cellphone from time to time to optimize its performance.

Switch the cellphone off before boarding an aircraft to avoid prosecution.

Switch the cellphone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, cellphones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the cellphone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, gas station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere. When the cellphone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump. In particular when using the cellphone you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, answer the call before holding your cellphone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let small children use your cellphone without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your cellphone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your cellphone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your cellphone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc.). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C to +55°C (the max value depends on device, materials and housing paint/texture).

Over 55°C the legibility of the cellphone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.  
Do not open or attempt to repair your cellphone yourself.  
Do not drop, throw or try to bend your cellphone.  
Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your cellphone model. TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Your cellphone should not be disposed of in a municipal waste. Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your cellphone.

Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult your doctor before playing video games on your cellphone or enabling a flashing-lights feature on your cellphone. #### • **BATTERY AND ACCESSORIES:**

Before removing the battery from your cellphone, please make sure that the cellphone is switched off. Observe the following precautions for battery use:

## • RADIO WAVES:

THIS CELLPHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES. Your cellphone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for cellphones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by public authorities such as the Federal Communications Commission of the US Government (FCC), or by Industry Canada, is 1.6 W/kg averaged over gram of body tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the cellphone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the cellphone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the cellphone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the cellphone. Before a cellphone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown.

The highest SAR value for this model cellphone when tested is 0.69 W/Kg for use at the ear and 0.95 W/Kg for use close to the body.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various cellphones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure. For body-worn operation, the cellphone meets FCC RF exposure guidelines provided that it is used with a non-metallic accessory with the handset at least 1.5 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

The World Health Organization (WHO) considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of cellphones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "hands-free" devices to keep cellphones away from the head and body. ## Protection against theft <sup>(1)</sup>

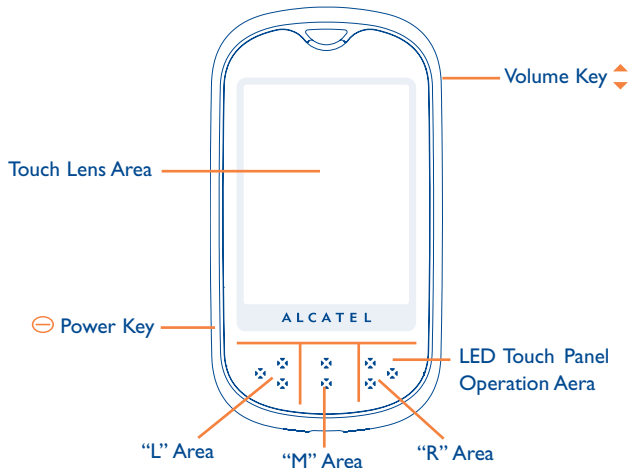

## 1.1 Keys&touch area

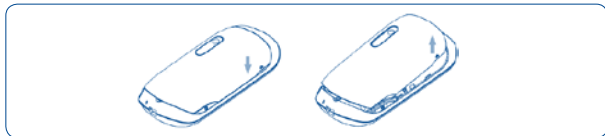

## 2 Getting started .....

### 2.1 Set-up

#### Removing or installing the back cover



#### Inserting and removing the SIM card <sup>(1)</sup>

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out. Please power off your phone before you remove the SIM card.

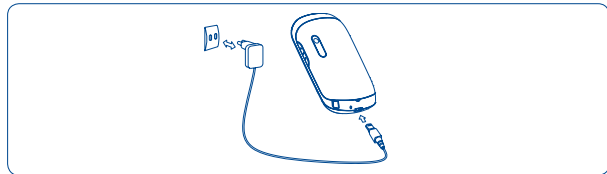

#### Installing and removing the battery




Insert and click the battery into place, make sure battery connecting with battery connector, then close the telephone cover. Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

#### Charging the battery




Connect the battery charger

- Charging may take about 20 minutes if the battery is flat.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). You are advised to fully charge the battery (  ).




The charge is complete when the animation stops. Only use Alcatel chargers.

## 2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  key until the telephone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary. The main screen is displayed.



If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your telephone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, touch the screen to browse through them or press the power  key to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, “**Searching/Emergency**” will be displayed.

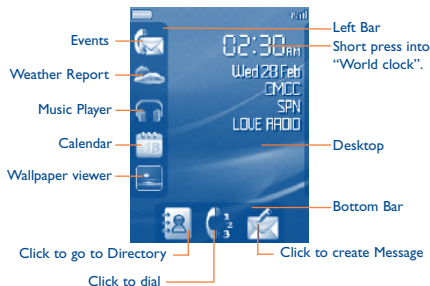
In the power on screen, you also have access to the functions of “**Radio**”, “**Camera**”, “**Music player**”, etc. even if there is no SIM card inserted.

## 2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the  key until the pop-up “Profile tab” appears, then select “Power off” and confirm.

# 4 Calls.....

## 4.1 Making a call



Dial

In Dial Interface, dial the desired number then press the or click "L" area in Led area to place a call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing or "R" area. If you input some digits, press or "M" area to save the numbers. If you did not input any digital, press or "M" area to enter into Directory.

To access the Dial interface quickly by clicking bottom bar key "" in idle interface (short press Power key to go back to idle interface)

To access Call Log quickly by clicking "L" area or .

To hang up a call, press "cancel" or click "R" Area

To input "+/p/w", long press

To input "0", short press

To exit dial Interface, press

### Making an emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and press the key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

## 4.2 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down key.

If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "My numbers" (see page 36).



To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

## 4.3 Receiving a call

A. When you receive an incoming call, the LED will flicker to notify you.

B. When the phone is Locked, click the "unlock" button. You can then click the "Answer" or "Reject" button to complete the operation in the touch screen. You can also click the "L" Area to answer a call and "R" Area to "reject" a call.

C. When the phone is unlocked you can directly answer or reject a call.

If the icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated and there is no ringtone. If the icon is displayed, the phone does not ring or vibrate.



The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

### Muting the ringtone

Hold down the volume key for Mute.

### Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the sound level during a call using the Volume  key.

### Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (ensure that “**Call waiting**” is activated, see page 37).
- To call a second party during a call, dial the number directly.

## 4.5 Conference calls <sup>(1)</sup>

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to five). If you are on a double call, press “**Options**” and select “**Conference**”. If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the “**Answer**” and speak with your new caller.

This caller becomes a member of the conference if you press “**Options**” and select “**Add to conference**”. Pressing “**End**” disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press “**Options**” and select “**End conf.**”

## 4.6 Line switching <sup>(1)</sup>

Your SIM card can contain two distinct telephone numbers. Under “**Call register**”, choose “**Line switching**” and then select a default line; all your outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls, however, will continue to use either of the two lines.



The services programmed on the default line do not impact those selected on the other line.

## 6 Messages .....



You can create, edit and receive SMS, MMS with this cellphone.


MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible cellphones.



The MMS function can only be used if the service is provided by your operator, and if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for MMS have been entered (see page 31).

### 6.1 Messages: Text/Multimedia message <sup>(1)</sup>

#### 6.1.1 Create message

You can click  in idle interface to create a message. Or select “**Messages**” from the Main Menu to create text/multimedia messages.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when images, videos, audio, slides or attachments are inserted; the message contains more than 8 pages of text.

You can type a message, but you can also modify a predefined message in **Templates** or customize your message by adding pictures, photos, sounds, titles, etc. (only available while editing an MMS). While writing a message, select “**Options**” to access all the messaging options.

You can save your messages that you send often to **Drafts** or **Templates (MMS only)**.



An SMS message of more than 160 characters (the number of characters depends on your language) will be charged as several SMS. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message.

### 6.1.2 Inbox

All received messages (read and unread) are stored in the same Inbox.

When viewing your messages, you will find the following status icons, depending on the type of message: unread SMS in phone, unread SMS in SIM card, read SMS in phone, read SMS in SIM card, unread MMS in phone, read MMS in phone, message reception in progress and message sending in progress.

### Receiving and reading SMS/MMS

When you receive a new message, a beep sounds and the icon showing the number of new messages will appear on the screen, The LED will also flicker.

Once you receive a message, the following options are given: **View**, **Reply**, **Forward** the message to another person, **Edit**, **Group by sender**, **Delete**, **Delete all**, **Move to archive** and extract number, URL (**Use number/Use URL**), etc.

#### Group by sender

Messages can be grouped by sender (“**Option/Group by sender**”). You are able to quick search the messages by pressing the key associated with the first letter of sender’s name.

#### Group unread message

Unread messages will always be positioned above the read messages.

### 6.1.3 Outbox

All failed to send messages.

### 6.1.4 Sent

All sent messages.

### 6.1.5 Drafts

All draft messages.

### 6.1.6 WAP Alerts

Store Web push messages.

### 6.1.7 Empty folder

Delete all messages in “**Inbox/Outbox/Sent/Drafts...**”.

### 6.1.8 Templates

A list of predefined messages is available. Select one, edit it if required, and then send it. You can also create your own predefined multimedia messages.

Record voice and send as MMS.

Take a photo and send as MMS.

Take a video and send as MMS.

-  SIM directory
-  Phone directory
-  Group

In addition to the directories already provided, you can create up to 5 groups (maximum 100 entries per group).

### Searching for a contact

You can search for a contact by multi-pressing the keys associated with the first letters and the other ones of their names.


### Reading a file

Select a name from your directory, then click to read the file.

## Sending Vcard via Bluetooth

Selecting the Vcard you wish to transfer (“**Options\Send vCard\By Bluetooth**”).

### Making the call















Click “Dial” in “Option” list or click M area after selecting Name. If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must first choose the number from the list (Cellphone, Home, Office, etc.) using the  key.



Information in the directory and the diary may be sent to and received from a computer using the PC suite.

## 7.2 Creating a file

### Default storage

- Set default storage to store new contacts.

- Set the number as your favourite, whose ringtone could be different.

### Set ringtone

- Set the number as your favourite whose ringtone you would like to be different.

### Send vCard

- Exchange data via SMS, MMS, Bluetooth or save to memory card.




- Directory manage**

## 8 Call register .....



### 8.1 Call memory

You can access your call memory by clicking  from the main screen or click  or "L" area on LED area in dial interface. Choose the option of the desired list:

-  Unanswered calls
-  Outgoing calls (Redial)
-  Answered calls

Select a number from the call memory and press the "Options" softkey to **View** call details, **Create text/multimedia message**, **Save** or **Delete** the selected number or clear the entire list (**Delete all**).

### 8.2 My numbers

Type in or modify your telephone number or the number to access your voicemail and confirm by clicking. Your telephone number is usually written on your SIM card.

### 8.3 Billing

You can access different items with this option:

- Amount**
  - You can view the total cost of charged calls, modify it or reset it and enter the cost of a Telecom Unit in the currency of your choice.
- Duration**
  - You can view the total duration of all outgoing calls or reset it.
- GPRS counter**
  - Management of the volume of data communications charged for (in kilobytes).

- Beep duration**
- You can activate or cancel the beep emitted during a call with a specified frequency (enter the frequency and confirm by click).

## 8.4 Call settings <sup>(1)</sup>


You can access a number of items with this option:

### 8.4.1 Call waiting

Activate/deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep.

### 8.4.2 Call forwarding

You can activate, cancel or verify the status of the call forwarding to the voicemail or to a specified number. The following configurations are possible:

### 8.4.5 Line switching <sup>(1)</sup>

Line switch between line 1 and line 2.

### 8.4.6 Auto redial

You can activate or deactivate the automatic callback of your party for calls that do not get through the first time.

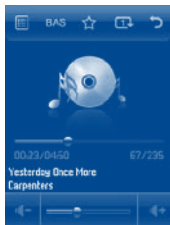
## 9.1 Music player <sup>(1)</sup>

Access this feature from the main menu by selecting “**Music player**”. You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your cellphone and memory card.

You can have access to your music files through one of the following:







- All songs** • Contains all songs both on phone memory and memory card.
- Folders** • Category of songs in folder.
- Update songs** • Update the information of songs saved in phone or memory card.
- Album/Artist/Genre** • Music files are categorized by Album, Artist or Genre based on information stored in the tags. Those missing such information will be classified as “**Unknown files**”.
- My star list** • You can simply add your favorite songs to “**My star list**” by holding down  during playing music (max 100).

Use keys to manage Music player:

The available options are:

-  Set volume level
-  Option menu of Music Player
-  place the current song in my star list
-  switch Equalizer
-  change play mode

### 9.1.1 Settings

Access by clicking  for following options:

- Play mode** • Normal, Repeat current, Repeat all, Shuffle and Repeat shuffle. You may also customize it by simply clicking  whilst playing music.
- Equalizer** • Different music styles are preset in the phone. You may also customize them by simply clicking  whilst playing music.
- Play in Bluetooth** • In play mode select to switch between play in speaker or play in BT stereo headset mode.
- Display** • Enable your player to display spectrum, song info. or lyric.

### 9.1.2 Playing with lyrics

Lyrics can be displayed in synchronization with the music.

## 9.2 Image Viewer .....



A library links to the pictures in “**My creations**” and “**My images**” in phone to be shown in list, slide, or thumbnail, set as Wallpaper, Screen saver, Power on/off display, and Contact ID, or sent by MMS, Bluetooth.

## 9.3 Radio.....



Your phone is equipped with a radio <sup>(1)</sup> with RDS functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

To view weather information for other cities. Press  key up or down.

To display today's weather information in full screen, Select "view" in "Option".

**Forecast** Display 3-day weather forecast.

**Update** Refresh weather information.

**My cities** List all my cities, you can add new city, set default city, delete the selected city, etc. via "**My cities\Options**".

**Settings** Set unit, update mode and network.

- store them in your “**File manager**”.
- send them in a multimedia message (MMS) to a cellphone or an email address.
- customize your main screen (see page 61).
- select them as incoming call image to a contact in your directory.
- transfer them by data cable or microSD card to your computer.
- modify your photos by adding frames (see page 49).

## 12.1 Access

Select  to access the function from main screen:

## 12.2 Camera

### 12.2.1 Take a photo, save or delete

The screen acts as the viewfinder. Position the object in the viewfinder and Click “M” area (LED is lighting) or click viewfinder directly to take the picture and the pictures will be automatically saved. If you don’t want it, you may directly delete it by Click left softkey “Delete”.

### 12.2.2 Settings in framing mode

Before taking the photo, you can adjust a number of settings by using the following shortcuts:

### 12.2.4 Modifying images

Access the “**File manager**”/“**My creations**” after taking a photo, and then select “**Edit**”.

## 12.3 Video

You can record a video clip of unlimited length, as long as the battery sustains and there is sufficient memory.



We strongly advise you to change the default folder to “**Memory card**” to store your photos and videos.

### 12.3.1 Framing mode

When you enter the “**Video**” function, you are in Framing mode. Use the cellphone screen as a viewfinder and press the “**Options**” softkey for the settings of **White balance, Exposure Value, Night mode, Banding, Quality, Record duration, Audio, Color mode, Saving location**, to access the “**File manager/My videos**”, and to restore default value.

### 12.3.2 Recording mode

Once you have chosen your settings, you can launch the recording of your video by clicking “**M**” area (LED is lighting).



If you receive a call in recording mode, video recording will be stopped and a pop up message will inquire if you want to save it.

### 12.3.3 Playing mode

In the list of “**My videos**”, press “**Options**” to play the video and send by MMS or Bluetooth.

## 13 Profiles .....

With this menu, you may personalise ringtones for different events and environments.

### 13.1 General

To modify the sound settings, press “**Options**” and select “**Edit**” and you will see the below functions using ◀ ▶:



Select a melody from the list using the ◀ ▶ key then confirm by pressing **OK** (see page 40).



Mode (normal, discreet, vibrate...). You may set your phone ringtone to Normal, Discreet (ring with beep), Vibrate (all sounds are replaced by vibrations except for alarms), Vibrate and ring, Vibrate then ring, Beep and vibrate, Silence (no sounds except for alarms, the 📞 icon will be displayed). Ringtones sound with increasing volume.



Adjust the volume using the ◀ ▶ key.



Select the type of key beep.



Select a melody for a new incoming message.



Select a melody for an alarm or appointment.



Power on beep.



Power off beep.

## 13.2 Silence

This profile will turn off all ringtones, even notification sounds.

## 13.3 Outdoor (loud)

It is a profile designed for outdoor users who requires louder ringtones.

## 13.4 Meeting

When activated your cellphone vibrates when a new event is due but the phone does not ring or beep with the exception of alarms.

## 13.5 Flight mode

Flight mode can be used to increase standby duration but you will have no voice call, Bluetooth or messaging functions.

# 4 File manager.....

You will have access to all audio and visual files stored in phone or memory card in File manager.

## 14.1 My audios

Choose an audio for the ON/OFF screen, for an incoming call, a message alert, power on/off ringtone or an alarm and scheduler.

The “**My audios**” album contains the following folders<sup>(1)</sup>:

- Music: full track music.
- Melodies: melodies that can be set as ringtone.
- Recorded: all recorded sounds.
- General: contains all audio files stored in phone or memory card.



DRM: Digital Rights Management feature allows sounds and images to be played while protecting the associated copyright. DRM counter-based files and files with expired rights will not be automatically played when scrolling the list.

## 14.2 My images

You can select an image or a photo as wallpaper, ON/OFF screen, or assign it to a contact in the directory.



The images will be displayed in alphabetical order.

## 14.3 My videos

The “**My videos**” album contains all video clips recorded by the user, originally embedded in the phone and downloaded to the phone or memory card.

Contains all video clips both in phone and memory card and enables you to **Play, Send (by MMS<sup>(2)</sup> or Bluetooth), Delete, Delete all, Rename, Sort (by name, type, time or size) and Copy or Move** the video/videos, and to **Download/Capture** new video clips.

<sup>(1)</sup> The embedded folder names cannot be modified. However, in certain cases, you can modify, delete and add items included in these folders.

## 14.4 My creations

This feature stores all the photos captured by your cellphone.

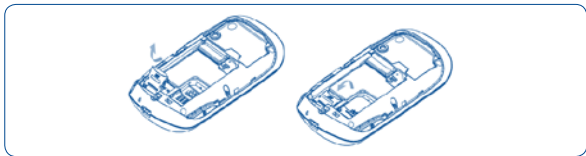
## 14.7 Memory card

You can access all files stored in memory card here.



When a memory card is inserted for the first time, it will be scanned and the default folders will be created.

### Inserting or removing the memory card



Remove back cover and battery, push outside and lift slot cover; put the MicroSD card into the slot as his shape, then lay down slot cover and push inside.

### Available options

- New folder** • Create more folders.
- Delete folder** • Remove folders.
- Rename folder** • Edit folder's name.

## 14.8 Managing audios, images, videos and creations

## 15 Bluetooth™ <sup>(1)</sup> .....



Access this feature by selecting “**Bluetooth**” in main menu.

To use your phone with a Bluetooth device, you need to proceed in two steps:

- Pair and register the device to your phone,
- Select it to use hands-free communication. Only one Bluetooth audio device (your Bluetooth headset or your Bluetooth car kit) can be connected during the communication.

### Pair and register your Bluetooth device

Activate the Bluetooth feature by selecting the “**Bluetooth\Activation\On**” option. Then enter the “**Device list**” menu to search for connectable Bluetooth devices and select the device you want to be paired with in the list. If the bluetooth device has no keyboard, enter its default password to register it with your phone. - View appointments** • See today’s appointments.
- List all appointments** • See all the created appointments.

- Jump to date** • Input the required date and it will be immediately highlighted.

## 16.2 Calculator.....



Access this feature by selecting “**Calculator**” from the main menu.

Enter a number, select the type of operation to be performed, and enter the second number, then press **=** key to display the result.

Once an operation is complete, you can select **C** to clear numbers and carry out a new operation.

To return to the main screen, Click “**R**” Area or slide from right to left on LED control panel.

## 16.3 Notes .....



You can create a note text or voice format by accessing “**Notes**” from the main menu.

### Available options:

- Open** • Open and view note.
- Send** • Send by SMS, MMS or Bluetooth.
- New text note/  
voice memo** • Add new text note or voice memo.
- Delete** • Delete note.
- Input mode** • Select input method.
- Languages** • Select language.

While recording a voice memo, you can define the audio format (AMR, WAV), Quality (High/Low), and Storage (Phone, memory card).

## 16.4 Clock.....



### 16.4.1 Alarm

Your cellphone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature. You can set up to five separate alarms and choose whether or not the alarm should repeat.

- Repeat** • You may select Once (default)/Every day/Days.
- Snooze** • The alarm will repeat at regular intervals. You may snooze it by setting “Alarm/Edit/Snooze” menu.

### 16.4.2 Clock

Allows you to display date and time settings including 12/24h format.

Also you can set the daylight saving adjustment.

### 16.4.3 World clock

The World clock shows current local time and the time in different cities. You may view up to 3 cities at one time (**Options\Set as my city**). Also, you can add a maximum of 10 new cities to the list (**Options\Add**).

# 17 Settings .....



From the main menu, select the menu icon  and select the function of your choice in order to customize your telephone.

## 17.1 Touch Settings

### 17.1.1 Touch calibration

You have two options: LED touch calibration & LCD touch calibration. To calibrate the touch screen, click anywhere on the screen to start calibration.

### 17.1.2 Touch Vibration

You may choose “on/off” for vibration when you touch screen or LED area.

## 17.2 Display

### 17.2.1 Home screen display

#### Wallpaper

The wallpaper is displayed when you switch on your telephone.

By selecting “**Wallpaper**” you can customize it by replacing the default image displayed on your telephone.



When you receive an event (incoming call, SMS/MMS, notifications, etc.) the icon, type and number of events will be displayed on your Widget Bar allowing you to consult them directly.

#### Screen saver

If you activate this option, the screen saver will be displayed shortly after the wallpaper. You can choose a picture or an animation as your screen saver.

#### Weather forecast (On/Off)

Select On/Off to display weather information on main screen.

### 17.2.2 Theme

This function enables you to customize the graphic style and the colours of your telephone.

### 17.2.3 Power On/Off <sup>(1)</sup>

You can customize your welcome animation or image that appears when you switch on your phone.

You can also customize your OFF screen with an image or animation.

### 17.2.4 Brightness

You may adjust black level with respect to LCD display.

### 17.2.5 Backlight

You may choose backlight time for screen.

## 17.3 Languages <sup>(2)</sup>

Display language for messages. The “**Automatic**” option selects the language according to the home network (if available).

## 17.4 Headset mode

Switch audio play (incoming call, message beep, alarm beep...) between Headset only and Phone&Headset.

## 17.5 Screen lock

### 17.5.1 Auto lock

Your Screen and LED Panel is locked automatically or can be locked manually by short press the power  key in idle interface

Short press power  key when locked

Or press Volume  key, pop up unlock confirmation bar, select “Press” button to unlock.

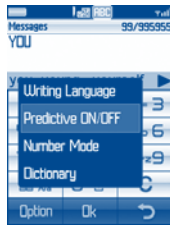

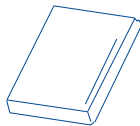

# 22 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the aftersales department, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimize its performance.
- You are advised to fully charge (  ) the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your telephone as this may affect the performance of your telephone.

and carry out the following checks:

### **My cellphone will not switch on**

- Press  until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your telephone back on

### **My phone has not responded for several minutes**

- Press the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the phone back on

### **My screen is difficult to read**

- Clean your screen
- Use your cellphone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

### **My cellphone turns off by itself**

- Check that your Touch Area is locked when you are not using your cellphone
- Check the battery charge level

### **My cellphone will not charge properly**

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; the battery charge indicator can take several minutes and may be accompanied by a quiet whistling sound
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C +40°C)
- Make sure your battery is inserted. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger
- Make sure you are using an Alcatel battery and charger
- When abroad, check that the electrical current is compatible


### **My cellphone will not connect to a network**

- Try connecting in another location
- Verify the network coverage with your operator
- Check with your operator that your SIM card is valid
- Try selecting the available network(s) manually (see page 65)
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded

### **SIM card error**

- Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see page 17)
- Verify with your operator that your SIM card is 3V compatible; the old 5V SIM cards cannot be used
- Make sure the chip on your SIM card is not damaged or scratched

### **Unable to make outgoing calls**

- Make sure you have dialled a valid number and press  in dial board
- For international calls, check the country and area codes
- Make sure your cellphone is connected to a network, and that the network is not overloaded or unavailable
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls (see page 37)



### Unable to receive incoming calls

- Make sure your cellphone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network)
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls (see page 38)
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls

### The caller's name does not appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator
- Your caller has concealed his/her number

### The sound quality of the calls is not optimal

- You can adjust the volume during a call by means of the  key
- Check the radio reception icon level 

### I am unable to use the features described in the manual

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service
- Make sure this feature does not require an Alcatel accessory

### When I select a number from my directory, the number is not dialed

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have selected the country prefix when calling a foreign country

### I am unable to create a file in my directory

- Make sure that your SIM card directory is not full; delete some files or save the files in the product directory (i.e. your professional or personal directories)

### My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail

- Contact your network operator to check service availability

### I cannot access my voicemail

- Make sure your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "My Numbers"
- Try later if the network is busy

### I am unable to send and receive messages MMS, Vox MMS

- Check your phone memory available as it might be full
- Contact your network operator to check service availability and check MMS parameters (see page 28)
- Verify the server center number or your MMS profile with your operator
- The server center may be swamped try again later

### The icon is displayed on my standby screen

- You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the product memory

### "No service" is displayed

- You are outside of the network coverage area

### I have already entered 3 incorrect PIN codes

- Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)

### I am unable to connect my telephone to my computer

- Install first of all Alcatel's PC suite
- Use "Install the connection" and perform the installation
- Check that your computer meets the requirements for Alcatel's PC Suite installation



### I am unable to download new files

- Check for free space
- Delete some files
- Select the MicroSD Card to store the files you downloaded
- Check your subscription status with your operator

### The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your cellphone is visible to other users (see page 56)

### My cellphone is dead, can't power on

- Make sure your battery is not completely used up or damaged.
- Remove your battery, **remove your SIM** card then power it on again.
- Hold down  key +  key at same time, then press up  key to reset it. <sup>(1)</sup>

<sup>(1)</sup> ALL User phone data: contacts, photos, messages, files and downloaded applications such as Java games will be **lost permanently**. Please do not remove battery during resetting.

### **My touch Lens doesn't work**

- Access to profile by long press power key, then long press up volume key to access LCD calibration and down volume key to access LED calibration.

### **How to make your battery last longer**

- Make sure you followed the complete charge time (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication
- Switch on the backlight upon request.
- Update weather info. upon demand manually or set its auto-check interval longer.
- Exit Java background-running applications if they are not being used for a long time.
- Deactivate Bluetooth when not in use.

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
