Safety precautions

Information for parents

Please read the operating instructions and safety precautions carefully before use. Explain the content and the hazards associated with using the phone to your children.



Remember to comply with legal requirements and local restrictions when using the phone. For example, in aeroplanes, petrol stations, hospitals or while driving.



Mobile phones can interfere with the functioning of medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemakers. Keep at least 20 cm/9 inches between phone and pacemaker. When using the mobile phone hold it to the ear which is further away from the pacemaker. For more information consult your doctor.



Small parts such as the SIM card, sealing stop, lens ring and lens cap can be dismantled and swallowed by small children. The phone must therefore be stored out of the reach of small children.



The mains voltage specified on the power supply unit (V) must not be exceeded. Otherwise the charging device may be destroyed.

The power supply must be plugged into an easily accessible AC mains power socket when charging the battery. The only way to turn off the charging device after charging the battery is to unplug it.



The ring tones (p. 20), info tones and handsfree talking are reproduced through the loudspeaker. Do not hold the phone to your ear when it rings or when you have switched on the handsfree function (p. 11). Otherwise you risk serious permanent damage to your hearing.



Do not place the phone near to electromagnetic data carriers such as credit cards and floppy disks. Information stored on them could be lost.



Only use original Siemens batteries (100% mercury-free) and -charging devices. Otherwise you risk serious damage to health and property. The battery could explode, for instance.



You may only open the phone to replace the battery (100 % mercury-free) or SIM card. You must not open the battery under any circumstances. All other changes to this device are strictly prohibited and will invalidate the guarantee.

Press the soft key to call up the function that is displayed as Text or icon on the grey fields above the key.

Dial displayed phone number or name, accept calls. In standby mode: Display the last calls.

Getting started

Getting started

Using the SIM card/battery

Your phone's display is delivered with a protective film. Remove this film before getting started. The service provider supplies you with a SIM card on which all the important data for your account is stored. If the SIM card is credit card-sized, snap out the smaller segment and trim any rough edges.

Press depression 1 to remove the cover downwards in the direction of the arrow 2.



Insert SIM card \mathfrak{J} and push it fully into the locating slot (make sure the angled corner is in the correct position \mathfrak{J}).



To remove the SIM card push the card here \mathfrak{S} .

Insert the battery sideways into the phone ⑥, then press downwards ⑦ until it engages.



To remove, press the retaining tab (8) then lift the battery out.

Place cover on phone and push to the upper edge, until it clicks into place ⑨.



Always switch off phone before removing the battery!

Only 3V and 1.8V SIM cards are supported. Please contact your service provider if you have an older card.

Charge battery

The battery is not fully charged when delivered. Plug charger cable into the bottom of the phone, plug power supply unit into a mains power socket and charge for at least **two hours**. The power supply unit heats up when used for long periods. This is normal and not dangerous.

When charging is in progress ➡ is displayed.

Charging time

An empty battery is fully charged after about 2 hours. Charging is only possible within a temperature range of +5 °C to +40 °C. If the temperature rises/falls 5 °C above/below this, the charge symbol flashes a warning. The mains voltage specified on the power supply unit must not be exceeded (Operating time, p. 35).

Charge icon not visible

If the battery has been discharged fully the charge icon is not immediately visible when the power supply unit is plugged in. It will appear after up to two hours. In this case the battery is fully charged after 3-4 hours.

Only use the power supply unit provided!

Display while in service

A beep sounds when the battery is nearly empty. The charge level of the battery is only displayed correctly after an uninterrupted charging/discharging cycle. You should therefore not remove the battery unnecessarily and where possible not terminate the charging process early.

Switch on/off, PIN

Switch on/off

Press and **hold** the On/Off/End key **?** to switch on or off.

Switch on/off. PIN

Enter PIN

The SIM card can be protected with a 4- to 8-digit PIN.

Enter the PIN using the number keys. The characters **** appear to ensure nobody can read your PIN on the display. Correct errors with Olean.

Confirm your input with OK. Logging on to the network will take a few seconds.

Emergency number (SOS)

Only to be used in real emergencies!

By pressing the soft key SOS you can make an emergency call on any network without a SIM card and without entering a PIN (not available in all countries).

Switching on your phone for the first time

Time/date

Set the clock to the right time once at start-up.

Press Yes. First enter the date (day/month/year), then the time (24 hours, including seconds). Press OK. The time and date are updated.

If the battery is removed for longer than 30 seconds, the clock will be reset.

Time zones

Set the time zone for your area.

Select the required time zone from list with (*). Apply with Set.

General instructions

Phonebook or Addressbook

You can choose whether you want to use the **Phonebook** on the SIM card or the internal **Addressbook** as standard.

You can copy the SIM card Phonebook to the Addressbook on the phone. Please do not interrupt this procedure. During this time do not accept incoming calls. Follow instructions in the display.

To copy data on the SIM card at a later time, highlight entries (see p. 9) and copy these with the function Copy into (Phonebook options menu).

You can change the default book at any time (p. 14).

Signal strength



Strong reception signal.



A weak signal reduces the call quality and may lead to loss of the connection. Change your location.

Without SIM card

If you switch on the phone **without** a SIM card you can still use some phone functions.

Press Menu. The functions are displayed (e.g. Emergency, SOS).

Menu control

The steps needed to reach a function are shown in a **condensed form** in this user guide.

E.g. to display call list for missed calls:



This comprises the following steps:

Open main menu, select , then select the function Calls missed. You have to confirm with Select.

Standby mode

Very often function descriptions begin in standby mode.

The phone is in **standby mode** and is **ready for use** when the name of the service provider appears on the display.

Press and **hold** the On/Off/End key **o** to return to standby mode from any situation.

Menu functions are made available in options menus. A selection of functions that occur frequently is shown here.

Highlighting mode

With some applications (e.g. Phonebook) one or more entries in a list can be highlighted to perform multiple functions at once.

Press Options -> Mark text.

Press Mark text to highlight an **unmarked** entry.

Press Unmark to unmark a **highlighted** entry.

The phone and SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

Keep these confidential numbers in a safe place where you can access them again if required.

Codes

PIN control

You can stop the PIN prompt being activated when the phone is switched on, but you then risk unauthorised use of the phone.

Press Change. Enter PIN and confirm with OK.

Change PIN

You can change the PIN to any 4- to 8-digit number you find easier to remember.

Enter current PIN and confirm with OK.
Enter new PIN twice and confirm each time with OK.

Change PIN2

(Display only if PIN2 is available). Proceed as with Change PIN.

Calling

Change phonecode

You define the phone code (4-8 digits) when you call up a protected function for the first time. It is then valid for all phonecode protected functions. If the wrong code is entered three times then the phone will be locked. Contact Siemens Customer Care for instructions on how to unlock your pone.

Clear SIM card barring

If the PIN is entered incorrectly three times, the SIM card is barred. Enter the PUK (MASTER PIN), provided by your service provider with the SIM card, according to instructions. If the PUK (MASTER PIN) has been lost, please contact your service provider.

Preventing accidental activation

Even if PIN control is deactivated confirmation is required to switch on the phone.

This prevents the phone from being switched on accidentally, e. g. when carried in a pocket or whilst you are on an aircraft.

Press and **hold** the On/Off/End key and confirm with **OK**. The phone switches on.

Calling

Dialling with number keys

The phone must be switched on (standby mode). Dial number (always with area code, if necessary with international dialling code). To dial international dialling code press and **hold** 0 until a "+" is displayed. Press **+List** and select country.

End call

Press the End key **hiefly**. Press this key even if the person on the other end of the line has hung up first.

Set volume

Use navigation key (*) to start adjusting the volume during conversation. Set volume with navigation key (*).

If a Car Kit is used, its volume setting will not affect the usual setting on the phone.

Redial

To redial numbers that were dialled previously, press the Call Key once, pick up the required phone number from the list with , then press again.

If the number is busy

Press Auto dial for automatically dialling the phone number ten times at increasing time intervalls or press Call back (영) for phone ringing when the busy number is free. Press Prompt and a beep reminds you to redial the dispayed phone number after 15 minutes.

Accept call

The phone must be switched on (standby mode). An incoming call will interrupt any other use of the phone. Press Answer or eals.

Please make sure you have accepted the call before holding the phone to your ear. This will avoid damage to your hearing from loud ring tones!

A phone number transmitted by the network is displayed or the corresponding name if it is contained in the Phonebook (p. 14) or Addressbook (p. 15). A picture may also appear (settings p. 15).

Reject call

Reject or 🕤 press briefly.

Handsfree

You can put the phone aside during a call. You can then hear the caller via the loudspeaker.

Activate handsfree function with Handsfr. and switch on with Yes.

Adjust the volume with (). Pressing Handsfr. switches off "handsfree talking".

Always switch off "handsfree talking" before holding the phone to your ear! This will avoid damage to your hearing!

Swapping between 2 calls



you can hear the "call waiting tone" (p. 23), you can accept the waiting call with Swap putting the current call on hold to do so.

Swap back and forth between the calls see above **or** end the current call with and accept the new call with **Answer**.

Conference

Call up to 5 parties and link them together in a conference call. Make a new connection during a call with menu Hold (dial a new phone number).

The current call is set on hold. With menu
Conference you can join the held call when the connection is established.

Repeat this procedure until all partici-

Repeat this procedure until all participants are linked together.

All calls in the conference are ended simultaneously when the End key sis pressed.

Direct call

If this is active, only **one** number can be dialled.

Menu Security Direct call

Press and enter phone code. The phone code (4- to 8-digits) is set by you and entered at the first security setting.

Please note this code down (see also p. 9)!

Confirm code input with OK. Press

Change and enter number (press to select phone number from the Adressbook p. 15 or Phonebook p. 14). Confirm "On" with OK.

To dial, press and **hold** the right soft key.
To switch direct call off, press and **hold** #.
Enter phone code and confirm with OK.
Press Change and Confirm Off with OK.

Text entry

Text entry without T9

Press number key repeatedly until the required letter appears. After a brief interval the cursor will advance. Example:

- Press once briefly to type the letter a, twice to type b, etc. Press and hold to write the number.
- Ä,ä,1-9 Umlauts and numbers are displayed after the relevant letters.

12 Text entry

Clear

Press **briefly** to delete the letter before the cursor, press and **hold** to erase the whole word.

Move the cursor (forwards/back).

Press briefly: Swap between abc, Abc, T9abc, T9Abc, T9ABC, 123. Status shown in top line of display.

Press and **hold**: All inputvariants are displayed.

Press briefly: Special characters are shown.

Press and **hold**: Open input menu.

O Press once/repeatedly:

Press and **hold**: Writes **0**.

Navigate to characters with (), () and press Select.

Input menu

Press and **hold*** with text input. The input menu ist displayed:

Text format (SMS only), Input language, Mark text, Copy/Add

Text entry with T9

"T9" deduces the correct word from the individual key entries by making comparisons with an extensive dictionary.

Activate, deactivate T9

Menu → ✓ → Message setup → T9 preferred → Change (activate/ deactivate T9).

Select Input language

Select the language in which you want to compose your message.

Menu → ⋈, → Message setup → Input language → Select (the new language is set)

Languages with T9 support are marked with the T9 symbol.

Write a word using T9

Since the display changes as you proceed, it is best if you finish a word without looking at the display.

Simply press the keys **once only** where the relevant letter is located. For "hotel", for example:

Press briefly # for T9Abc then 4 6 8 3 5 and 1 (the blank ends a word). Do not use special characters such as Ä but rather use the standard characters, e.g. A; T9 will do the rest for you.

Additional information

- O Set a full stop. A word is concluded if it is followed by a space.
 Within a word, a full stop represents an apostrophe or hyphen:
 e.g. provider.s = provider's.
- Go to the right. Ends a word.

Press briefly: Swap between: abc, Abc, T9abc, T9Abc, 123. Status shown in top line of display. Press and hold: All input modes

are displayed.

Press **briefly:** Select special characters (p. 12).

Press and hold: Open input menu

T9 word suggestions

If several options are found in the dictionary for a key sequence (a word), the most probable is displayed first. If the word you want has not been recognised, the next suggestion from T9 may be correct.

The word must be highlighted. Then press [12]. The displayed word is replaced with a different word. If this word is also incorrect, repeat until the correct word is displayed.

To add a word to the dictionary, select Spell. Now write the word without T9-support and accept with Save into the dictionary.

Correct a word

Words written with T9:

With move left or right, word by word, until the required word is highlighted.

With 121s scroll through the T9 word suggestions again. Clear deletes the character to the left of the cursor **and** displays a new possible word!

Words not written with T9:

With move letter by letter to the left/right. Clear deletes the letter to the left of the cursor. New characters are inserted at the cursor position.

Text modules can be stored in the phone for adding to your messages (SMS, MMS).

Write text modules

Menu → ✓ → Text modules
→ <New entry> → ☐ (write text module) → Save (Accept the default name or give it a new name, then save with OK)

Use text modules

(write message text) → Options

→ Text modules → (select text module from the list) → (confirm Text module) → OK.

The predefined text is inserted into the text to the left of the cursor.

Entries in the standard directory (Addressbook or Phonebook) are shown for selection.


Birthday

After entering the date of birth, the "reminder box" can be activated. You can now enter the time for the reminder. The phone will then remind you with an accoustic tone and also with a display one day before the birthday and on the birthday.

All fields

Press Select. Show all input fields if the display was previously reduced (Options Field setup).

Change entry



Call (search for an entry)

Open Addressbook , select name and and select phone number (if the entry has several numbers stored) press .

Voice dialling

Dial numbers by voice command. Up to 20 recorded names for voice dialling or voice commands (p. 30) can be saved on the mobile (not on the SIM card).
