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#### Information for parents

Please read the operating instructions and safety precautions carefully before use. Explain the content and the hazards associated with using the phone to your children.



Remember to comply with legal requirements and local restrictions when using the phone. For example in aeroplanes, petrol stations, hospitals or while driving.



Mobile phones can interfere with the functioning of medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemakers. Keep at least 20 cm/9 inches between phone and pacemaker. When using the mobile phone hold it to the ear which is further away from the pacemaker. For more information consult your doctor.



The SIM card may be removed. Caution! Small parts like this could be swallowed by young children



The mains voltage specified on the power supply unit (Volt) must not be exceeded. Otherwise the charging device may be destroyed.



The ringtone (p. 67), info tones (p. 68) and handsfree talking are reproduced through the loudspeaker. Do not hold the phone to your ear when it rings or when you have switched on the handsfree function (p. 20). Otherwise you risk serious permanent damage to your hearing.



Only use original Siemens batteries (100 % mercury-free) and – charging devices. Otherwise you risk serious damage to health and property. The battery could explode, for instance.



You may only open the phone to replace the battery (100 % mercury-free) or SIM card. You must not open the battery under any circumstances. All other changes to this device are strictly prohibited and will invalidate the operating licence.

#### Please note:



Please dispose of unwanted batteries and phones as permitted by the laws in your country.



The phone may cause interference in the vicinity of TV sets, radios and PCs.



Use only Siemens original accessories. This will avoid potential risks to health or property and ensure compliance with all relevant regulations.

If you wear the phone around your neck, please use only the Siemens original FCT-500 Loop Case. In order to avoid any injuries or death from strangulation no other accessories are allowed for this purpose. Childs up to 14 years shall not wear the phone around the neck.





Your phone's display is delivered with a protective film.

### Remove this film before getting started.

In rare cases the static discharge may cause discolouration at the edges of the display. However this will disappear within 10 minutes.

# Insert SIM card/battery

The service provider supplies you with a SIM card on which all the important data for your account is stored. If the SIM card is in creditcard size, snap out the smaller segment out and remove rough edges.


 Remove the battery cover by pressing top centre of the cover and slide downwards.



 Insert the SIM card into the slot with the contact area facing downwards and push gently until it engages below the holder (make sure the angled corner is in the correct position).



 Place the battery into the block of the phone, with the contact area facing down. Push the battery carefully downwards.



• Slide the battery cover upwards from the bottom of the phone, until it latches into place.



#### Note

Always switch off phone before removing the battery!

Only 3V SIM cards are supported. Please contact your service provider, if you have an older card.

# Charging the battery

The battery is not supplied fully charged. Plug the charger cable into the bottom of the phone, plug the power supply unit into the mains power socket and charge for at least 3,5 hours.



### Display when charging is in progress



During charging.

### Charging time

An empty battery is fully charged after about 3,5 hours. Charging is only possible within the temperature range of +0 °C to +45 °C. If the temperature rises/falls above/below this, the charge symbol flashes a warning. The voltage specified on the power supply unit must not be exceeded.

To obtain maximum performance of the battery it must be fully charged and then emptied at least five times.

### Charge icon not visible

If the battery was completely discharged, the charging symbol will not be immediately visible when connected to the charger. In this case the battery is fully charged after 4,5-5,5 hours.

Only use the charger provided!

### Display while in service

Charge level display during operation (empty-full):







A beep sounds when the battery is nearly empty. The charge level of the battery is displayed correctly only after uninterrupted charging/discharging. You should therefore not remove the battery unnecessarily and where possible not interrupt charging prematurely.

### Note

The charger will become hot after extended use. This is normal and not dangerous.

# Activate/deactivate



Hold down On/Off/End kev to switch on or off.

# **Enter PIN**

The SIM card can be protected with a 4-8 digit PIN.



Enter the PIN using the number kevs. The characters \*\*\*\* appear to ensure nobody can read your PIN on the display. Correct errors with <C.





Confirm your input with the right soft key. Logging on to the network will take a few seconds.

# Switching on your phone for the first time

### Time and date

The clock must be set to the right time once at start-up.



Press.



Enter the time, validate with OK.



Enter the date, validate with OK.

Now you are also asked if you want to copy the SIM card phonebook entries to the Addressbook on the phone. If you choose Yes, please do not interrupt this procedure. During this time do not accept incoming calls. Follow instructions on the display.

You are able to copy data from the SIM card later on (page 30).

# Standby mode



When the name of the service provider appears on the display, the phone is in **standby mode** and **ready for use**.

The left soft key may have different functions pre-assigned.



Hold **down** the On/Off/End key to return to standby mode from any menu option.

## **Emergency number (SOS)**

Only to be used in real emergencies!

By pressing the soft key, SOS you can make an emergency call on any network without a SIM card and without entering a PIN (not available in all countries).





# Codes

DIN

The phone and the SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

Keep these confidential numbers in a safe place where you can access them again if required.

PIN	Protects your SIM card (personal identification number).
PIN2	This is needed to set the charge detail display and to access additional functions requiring special SIM cards.
PUK PUK2	Key code. Used to unlock SIM cards after the wrong PIN has been entered repeatedly.
Phone code	Protects your phone.

Menu → 5/3 → Security → Codes

#### PIN control

The PIN is usually requested each time the phone is switched on. You can deactivate this feature but you risk unauthorised use of the phone. Some service providers do not permit deactivating the control.



# **Change PIN**

You can change the PIN to any 4-8 digit number you find easier to remember.



# **Change PIN2**

(display only if PIN 2 is available). Proceed as with **Change PIN**.

### Chg.phonecode

The preset phonecode is 0000 for all phonecode protected functions. You are able to change it:

# **Clear SIM-card barring**

If the PIN is entered incorrectly three times, the SIM card is barred. Enter the PUK (MASTER PIN), provided by your service provider with the SIM card, according to instructions. If the PUK (MASTER PIN) has been lost, please contact your service provider.

# Prevent accidental activation

Even if PIN entry is deactivated (see page 15), confirmation is required to switch on the phone.

This prevents the phone from being switched on accidentally, e.g. when you are carrying it in a pocket.

Press. The phone switches on.

Press or take no action. The switching-on operation is broken off. Change your phone to match your personal requirements.

# Dialling with number keys

The phone must be switched on (standby mode).

# Set volume

# If number is busy

If the number called is busy or cannot be reached because of network problems, you are able to choose (depending on the service provider):

#### Automatic redial of last number

Press. A beep reminds you to redial the displayed phone number after 15 minutes.

An incoming or outgoing call or Off interrupts these functions.

"T9" deduces the correct word from the individual key entries by making comparisons with an extensive dictionary.

### Type a word using T9

The display changes as you proceed. Therefore, it is best if you finish a word without looking at the display.

Simply press the keys **once only** where the relevant letter is located. For "hotel", for example:



press briefly for <sup>T9</sup>**Abc**, then

A blank ends a word.

Do not use special characters such as Ä but write the standard characters, e.q. A; T9 will do the rest for you.

### Note



Setting a full stop. The word is ended when followed by a blank space. Within a word, a full stop represents an apostrophe or hyphen:



e.g. provider.s = provider's.

Move to the right. Ends a word.

Press briefly: Switch between: abc, Abc, <sup>T9</sup>abc, <sup>T9</sup>Abc, 123. Status indicator in the top line of the display.

**Hold down:** All input modes are displayed.



Press briefly: Select special characters (page 23).

Hold down: All input languages are displayed.

### T9 word suggestions

If several options are found in the dictionary for a key sequence (a word), the most probable is displayed first.

The word must be highlighted. Then press



again. The displayed word is replaced with a different word. If this is also incorrect, repeat until the correct word is displayed.

If the word you want is not in the dictionary, it can also be written without T9.



To add a word to the dictionary:



The last suggestion is deleted and the word may now be entered without T9 support. Press OK to add it automatically to the dictionary.

The Multimedia Messaging Service enables you to send texts, pictures (also photos) and sounds in a combined message to another mobile phone or to an e-mail address. All elements of a MMS message are merged to form a "slide show".



## Dial-up access GPRS

Ø. (General Packet Radio Service)

GPRS is a new method for transmitting data faster in the mobile network. If you use GPRS and if the network has sufficient capacity, you can be connected to the Internet permanently.

#### **FMS**

(Enhanced Messaging Service) Besides (formatted) texts, you can also send

- pictures (bitmaps) up to max. 32 x 32 pixels (black and white),
- sounds.
- · animations (sequence of 4 pictures) 8 x 8 and 16 x 16 pixels (black and white),

using the EMS.

The elements listed above can be transmitted individually or together in an SMS.

With EMS, pictures and sounds can also be sent (e.g. as screensavers and ringtones).

This can result in messages exceeding the length of a single SMS. In this case individual text messages are concatenated to form a single message.

### International dialling codes

Many international dialling codes are stored in your phone. In standby mode:



Hold down until a "+" is displayed. This replaces the first two digits of the international dialling code.

+List Press.

Select the required country. The international dialling code is displayed. Now add the national number (in many countries without the first digit) and press the Call key.

## Message memory full

The SIM memory is full when the message icon flashes. No more SMS messages can be received. Delete or save messages (page 45).

## Outside your own home network

If you are outside your "home" network your phone will automatically dial a different GSM network (page 74).

#### Own numbers

You can enter your "own numbers" in the Addressbook (e.g. fax) for information. These numbers can be changed or deleted and also sent as an SMS.

#### **Performance**

A full battery will give you between 60 to 250 hours of standby time or 1,5 to 4,5 hours of talktime.
